It is impossible to explain to a nine year old that corporate greed is preventing her father from helping her with her homework. This price gouging is not worth the price of the families destroyed.

Please help us get these ~~phone~~ <sup>phone rates</sup> down. I am 38 yrs old doing 30 yrs for non-violent, non-sexual, charges. My charges are drugs and theft. I have three children Brad 22, Lindsay 14, & Ryke 9 and I love them. They live with my wife Stephanie and she struggles financially due to having only a single income. Now there is very little extra money to spend and 20<sup>00</sup> deposit onto my Global tel phone account will only get us 3 1/2 15 minute calls. So while \$40<sup>00</sup> on a pre paid cell phone will cover 30 days worth of Talk, Text and Internet, our 20<sup>00</sup> won't even allow me 15 minutes for each child and my wife! With the economy and gas prices the way they are it cost my wife \$150<sup>00</sup> to travel across state with my kids, stay the night and eat at visitation etc.. so obviously we can't do that often and while I do realize all this is product of my own actions my children are suffering more than necessary by not even being able to talk to me on the phone because of outrageously high prices.

Please help relieve the financial burden off of our families who have not committed any crime by getting us reasonable phone rates so we can keep family ties strong which is important for are rehabilitation as well as our childrens mental stability, so they know we love them.
